












The baby in the basket

And who should come along but the king's own daughter!


'Oh!' said the princess. 'What a sweet baby. I'll look after you!'

Jesus and his friends were on their way to the big city of Jerusalem.


'There's a little donkey in that village,' Jesus said to his friends one day. 'No one has ever sat on his back. It's young and wild, but I want you to bring it to me.'


